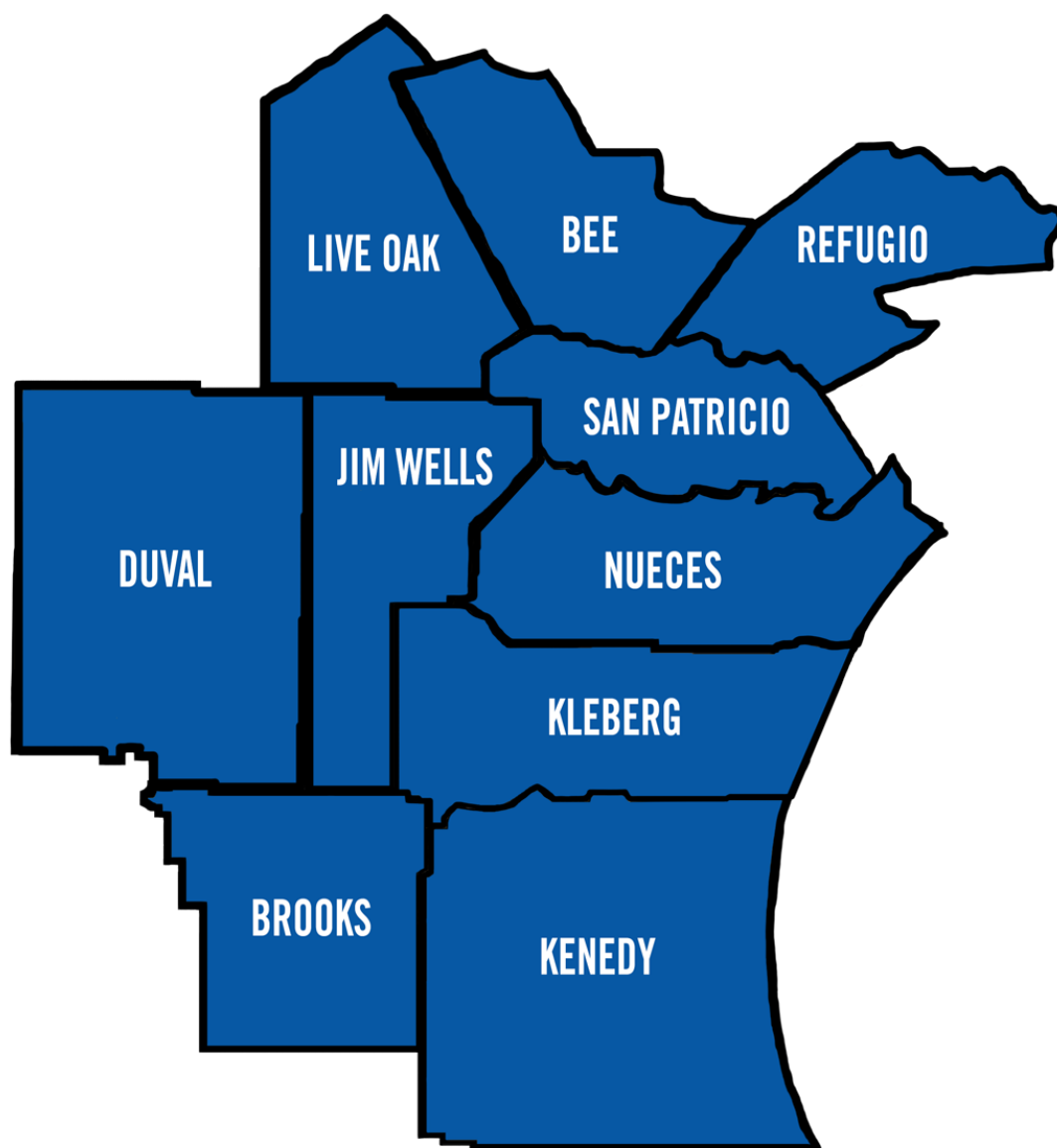

At United Way of the Coastal Bend, we not only dream to LIVE UNITED, we actually do it. We join forces with thousands of community partners, foundations and donors from diverse backgrounds and with various beliefs - all with a common goal of improving lives in our community.

We LIVE UNITED to serve our most vulnerable residents, many of whom previously had never needed help. Circumstances beyond our control can interrupt our lives, and before we know it, we find ourselves in line to get food for our children.

Together, we helped 189,819 residents this past year as we continue to change lives in the areas of education, health and financial stability.

This annual report covers our fiscal year from July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, and offers just a fraction of the life-changing work we do with our donors, volunteers and community partners. We're an independent, locally governed organization serving 10 Coastal Bend counties that's proud to say: "What's raised here, stays here!"

We LIVE UNITED by partnering with more than 60 agencies in programs across South Texas communities and invested more than \$2.6 million in much-needed services. In addition, we manage more than \$1.5 million

to provide home visiting programs to parents and income tax assistance to qualifying individuals. Add the value of volunteer hours and in-kind contributions, and our local financial investment is more than \$4.3 million.

We LIVE UNITED by leading many key community programs, including Success By 6 Early Childhood initiative and Operation Supply Our Students. We offer free educational opportunities, and this past year, we hosted several free virtual community discussions on decreasing the impact of childhood trauma, understanding addiction, cumulative stress and self-care and board development for nonprofits.

This year, we also established our first Tocqueville Society to recognize individuals who contribute at least \$10,000 annually to United Way of the Coastal Bend. These donors join a national network of philanthropic leaders who are engaged locally to create long-lasting, positive changes.

We proudly maintain a four-star rating – the highest possible – with Charity Navigator, and we keep five years of financial records and audits on our website. We do all of this while practicing and upholding the values of diversity, equity and inclusion.

Our commitment to you is to build upon what we've done for 86 years – bring together our community's human and financial resources to provide a hand up to those in need. By living united, we push forward and help each other. Thank you for making that possible. Thank you for caring.

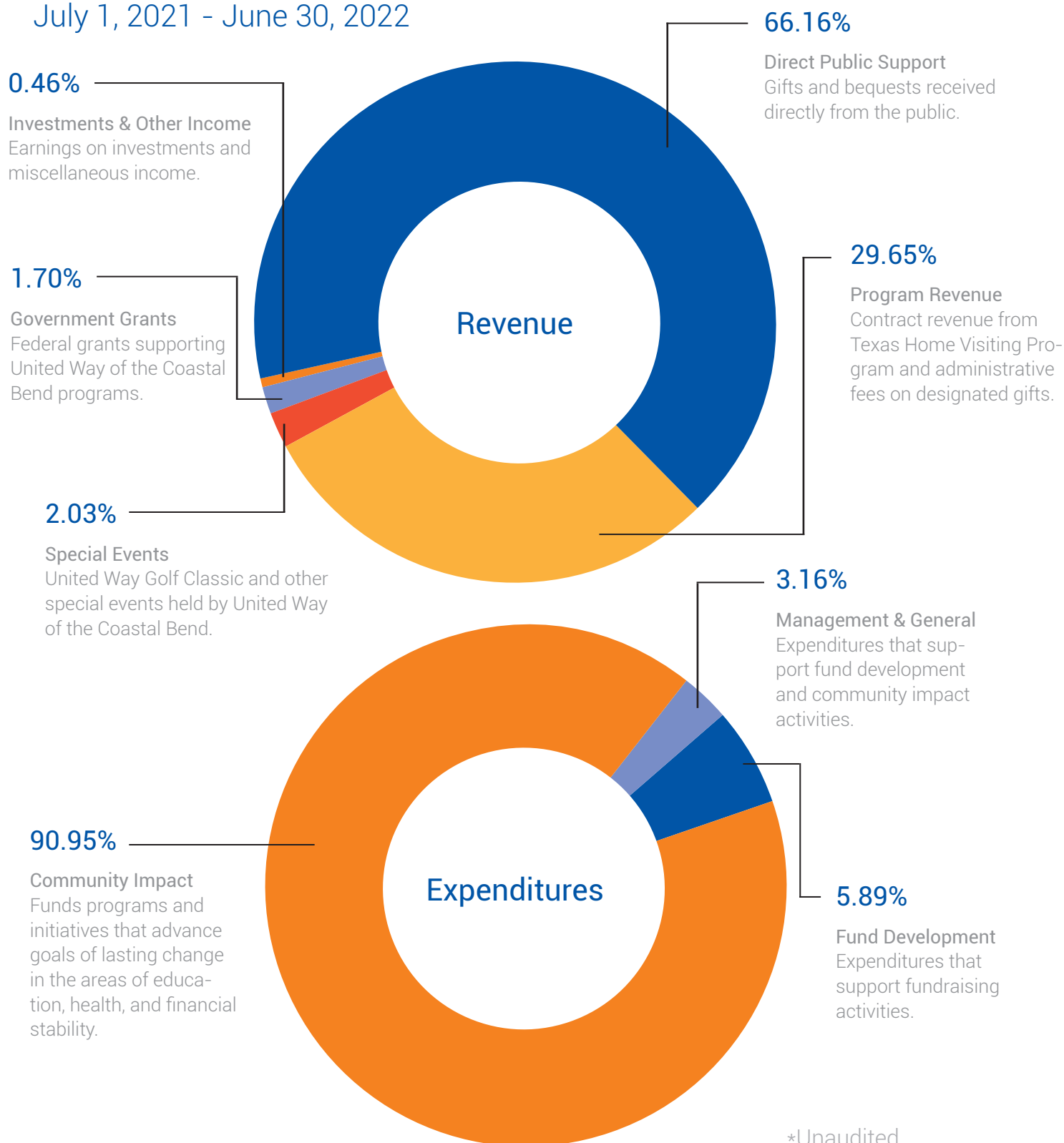

Exploring NEW HORIZONS & OPPORTUNITIES



United Way of the Coastal Bend Tocqueville Society

"I must say that I have seen Americans make a great deal of real sacrifices to the public welfare; and have noticed a hundred instances in which they hardly ever failed to lend a faithful support to one another." – Alexis Charles-Henri de Tocqueville

In 1831, renowned French political philosopher Alexis Charles-Henri de Tocqueville traveled America, recording his observations of life in the young nation. He applauded and immortalized American voluntary action on behalf of the common good. His words capture the essence of personal philanthropy that persists today, almost three centuries later. South Texans understand that advancing the common good means creating opportunities for a better life for all.

United Way of the Coastal Bend's Tocqueville Society recognizes philanthropic leaders and volunteer champions who have devoted time, talent, and funds to create long-lasting changes by tackling our communities' most serious issues.

Membership in the Society is granted to individuals who contribute at least \$10,000 annually to their local United Way. Founded in Nashville in 1984, the Tocqueville Society is now more than 25,000 members strong worldwide with more than \$9 billion contributed by its members.

Serving as co-chairs of the newly established local chapter are UWCB Board Members Erik Simpson, Vice President and General Manager of Valero Three Rivers, and Kevin Lassahn, Vice President and General Manager of Valero Corpus Christi Refineries.



Women United of the Coastal Bend

During Summer 2022, Women United started a new reading program to promote literacy. Members of the group went to classrooms at the four Neighborhood Centers of Corpus Christi and read to three- to five-year-old children each Wednesday.

On the fourth Wednesday of each month, each child received a book paid for by the Women United group to take home to build their home library. The program continued during the summer months and into the fall. In all, more than 100 students heard stories read by Women United volunteers.



Community Resiliency Fund

United Way of the Coastal Bend (UWCB) established an ongoing Community Resiliency Fund to respond instantly to community-wide emergencies, such as natural disasters, epidemics and economic crises. With partnerships already in place with more than 60 Coastal Bend nonprofits, UWCB is uniquely situated to respond quickly and efficiently, immediately delivering funds to provide services for those in need.

Current funds: \$34,541

While UWCB has been successful in raising and distributing funds following past crises, ensuring monies are on-hand prior to an emergency means people can receive help sooner.

Board & financial training for nonprofits

To support local nonprofit organizations beyond monetary donations, United Way of the Coastal Bend offered several free training opportunities to help agencies operate more efficiently and effectively. Topics included board development, employment law and financial best practices. UWCB works with more than 60 nonprofits in a 10-county area.

Improving school readiness through our SUCCESS BY 6 INITIATIVE

Our Success By 6 Early Childhood Initiative is a community coalition focused on improving school readiness in children ages 0-5. Working with local agencies, community partners, schools and childcare centers, the initiative provides resources, workshops and events that are child-focused and family-driven to promote the health and development of children in Nueces County. From July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, Success By 6 impacted 2,262 children.



Happy Birthday Baby!

Happy Birthday Baby! is a literacy initiative aimed at strengthening parent-child interactions for bonding and early learning. The initiative provides care bags filled with books, materials and information to families of newborns delivered at local hospitals.



Healthy Mom, Healthy Baby! Community Resource Fair

To raise prenatal care awareness, Success By 6 hosts a resource fair for expectant mothers and those preparing for pregnancy. Attendees receive care items and information about resources available in the community.



Read Across America Day

Success By 6 brings volunteers into local classrooms to read to children for Read Across America Day. The goal is to instill a love of reading from an early age and remind parents how important it is to read with their children every day.



Read to Lead Preschool Camp

Our Read to Lead Preschool Camps support families by providing school readiness activities. Using small group story time with related activities, preschool children engage in diverse experiences that enhance their literacy, math, and science concepts.



Week of the Young Child

Promoting early literacy development in young children, Success By 6 provides a fun, free public event to highlight community resources and engage families in early learning activities. Activities are low-cost/no-cost so they can be easily replicated at home.

Supporting families through our HOME VISITING PROGRAMS

United Way of the Coastal Bend oversees several home visitation efforts for parents of children under five as well as our own in-house Nurse-Family Partnership program for first-time mothers.



Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP)

Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) is a free community health program that supports first-time moms residing in Nueces county or San Patricio county by having specially-trained nurses regularly visit and provide support early in the pregnancy through the child's second birthday. **From July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022, the program graduated 56 clients and served 194 first-time mothers.**



Parents as Teachers (PAT)

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a parent education, family support, and school readiness program for families in Nueces county with children ages 0-5. **From July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, PAT graduated 7 clients and served 122 families.** The program continues to see high retention among families.



Home Instruction for Parents of Pre-School Youngsters (HIPPY)

Home Instruction for Parents of Pre-School Youngsters (HIPPY) is a home-based school readiness program that helps parents prepare their children ages 3-5 for success in school and beyond. The parent is provided a curriculum, books and materials designed to strengthen their child's cognitive and literacy skills, as well as their social, emotional, and physical development. **From July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022, the HIPPY program graduated 44 clients, and served 86 children and 74 families.**

Meeting our community's needs through SPECIAL EVENTS

United Way of the Coastal Bend takes part in annual events that support education, health and/or financial stability initiatives in our community. We are grateful to the donors, contributors, partners and volunteers who continue to make these events successful.



Operation Supply Our Students

Raised \$85,354

United Way of the Coastal Bend raised more than \$85,000, including in-kind contributions, and helped more than 17,000 Coastal Bend students in the 2021-2022 school year. The donations provided basic school supplies to the 43 public school districts in United Way of the Coastal Bend's 10-county service area.



Golf Classic

Raised \$128,915

The 28th annual United Way Golf Classic raised more than \$128,000 in 2021 to support United Way of the Coastal Bend's Community Investment Fund. More than 250 golfers participated in the event. The event's Presenting Sponsors were CITGO and Stronghold. Steel Dynamics was the Community Sponsor.



Corpus Christi Caller-Times Children's Christmas Appeal

Raised \$79,494

The Corpus Christi Caller-Times Children's Christmas Appeal is a decades-long partnership that ensures children served by health and human service agencies are provided basic needs and gifts during the holiday season. The Children's Christmas Appeal raised \$79,494 for Coastal Bend children in 2021.

Leadership giving contributions are essential to United Way of the Coastal Bend. These generous donors make significant investments in our community to ensure local families have the resources they need to become educated, healthy, and financially stable.

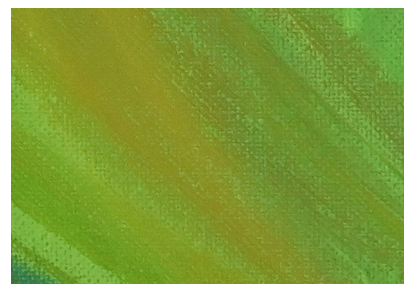
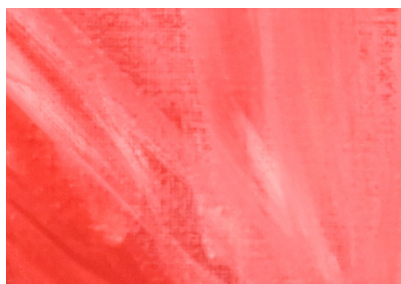
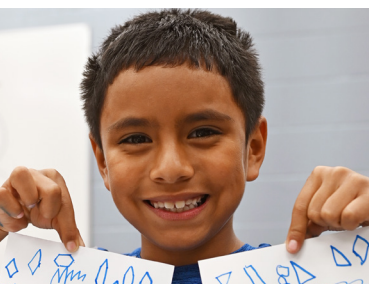
