A LETTER FROM LEADERSHIP

LIVE UNITED has been our mantra for years, and never is that commitment needed more than now.

The global pandemic forced us to LIVE UNITED from a distance as many Coastal Bend residents stayed home, donned masks and lived in isolation. The coronavirus and economic shutdown left thousands unemployed, unable to pay basic living expenses. The demand for services spiked at a time when fundraisers and donations became scarce.

Still, this community joined forces to serve our vulnerable residents, many of whom had never before needed help. Circumstances beyond our control can interrupt our lives, and before we know it, we find ourselves in line to receive food for our children.

We were able to help more than 100,000 residents this past year as we continue to change lives in the areas of education, health and financial stability. This annual report covers our fiscal year from July 1, 2019-June 30, 2020, and offers a glimpse into the life-changing work we do with our donors, volunteers and community partners. We're an independent, locally-governed organization serving 10 Coastal Bend counties that's proud to say: "What's raised here, stays here!"

United Way of the Coastal Bend raised more than \$720,000 to help local residents affected by COVID-19. With 100 percent of those donations going toward local response and recovery efforts, we distributed those funds to 40 agencies providing direct services. An average of 39,000 people monthly were supported during the pandemic with food, rent, utilities, health care, mental health assistance and child care for essential workers – that's in addition to the more than 100,000 people served through traditional programs.

We also partnered with the City of Corpus Christi to administer a \$475,000 Nonprofit Recovery Fund to help keep nonprofits in business during the COVID-19 economic shutdown. Many saw a loss in revenue due to cancelled fundraisers and decreased donations, leading to cuts in services and employee layoffs. More than 30 agencies received grants ranging from \$3,000 to \$25,000 to help pay for administrative expenses such as payroll, utilities and insurance.

Helping find solutions during our most difficult times has been a key responsibility since being established in 1936. We partner with more than 50 agencies in programs across 60 South Texas communities with the mission of improving lives by mobilizing the caring power of community. We achieve our goals with the help of donations through workplace campaigns, corporate gifts and individual donations.

We're also involved in many key community programs, including the Nurse-Family Partnership, Success By 6 Early Childhood Initiative, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program and Operation Supply Our Students (Operation SOS). We also launched Women United and hosted community discussions on important topics such as homelessness, addiction and racism. We proudly maintain a four-star rating – the highest available – with Charity Navigator, and we keep five years of financial records and audits on our website. We do all of this while practicing and upholding the values of diversity, equity and inclusion, with our Board of Directors approving a formal statement this year that can be found on Page 3 of this report.

The challenges of 2020 are far from over, yet our community proved once again that together, we can overcome hardships. Life is better when we LIVE UNITED because UNITED, WE ALL WIN!

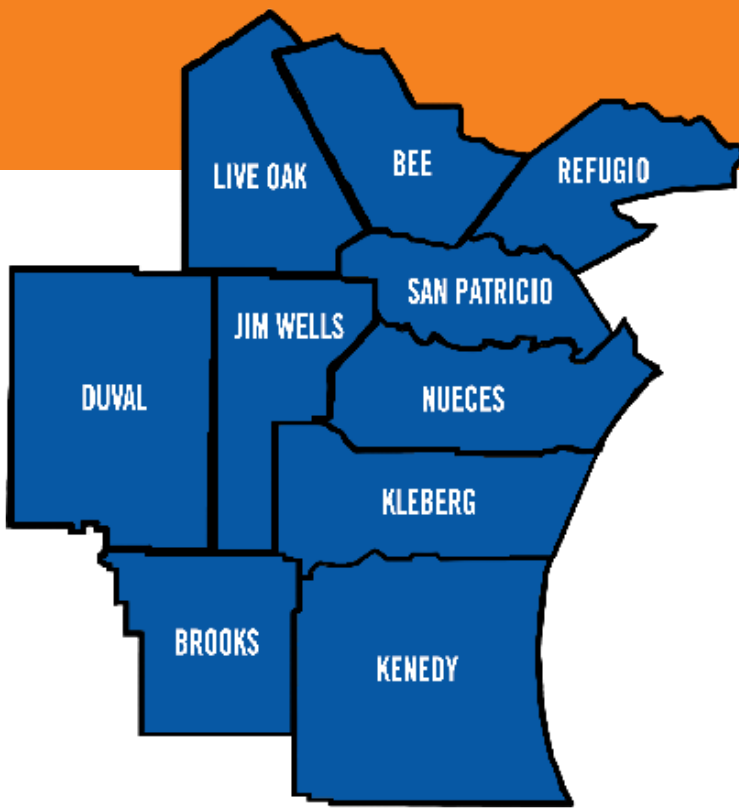

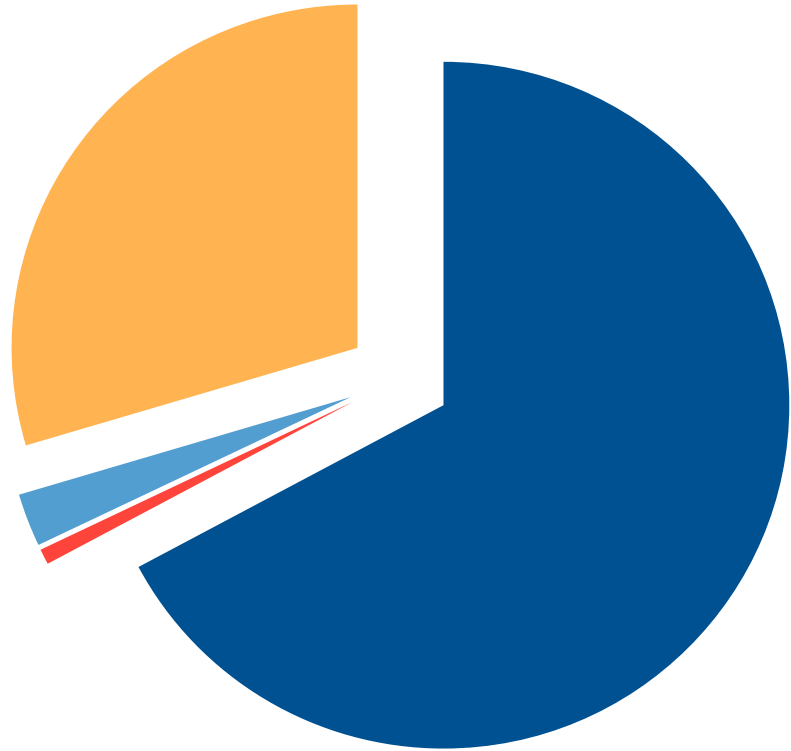

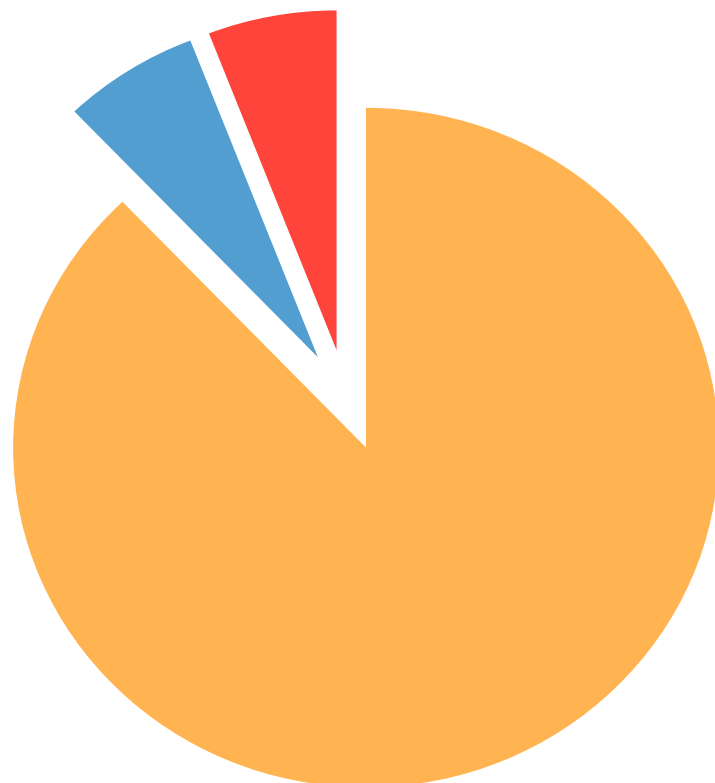

HELPING THOSE AFFECTED BY COVID-19

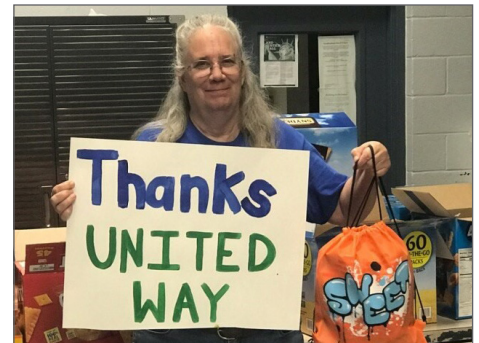
COVID-19 RESPONSE & RECOVERY FUND

When the effects of the pandemic began to be felt in the Coastal Bend, United Way of the Coastal Bend established a COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund to help local nonprofits provide direct services to Coastal Bend residents.

With 100 percent of all donations going toward local response and recovery efforts, the fund **raised more than \$720,000** which was distributed to **40 Coastal Bend organizations**.

In addition to financial grants, United Way of the Coastal Bend also provided facial masks to many nonprofit agencies for their employees, clients and visitors

“We’re so appreciative of the donors and companies who supported our efforts, especially at a time when many face great uncertainty,” said Libby Averyt, President & CEO of United Way of the Coastal Bend. “Though there’s still work to be done, it’s through the continued support of our community that we can help the Coastal Bend respond, recover, rebuild and re-imagine for the future.”



COVID-19 NONPROFIT RECOVERY FUND

The City of Corpus Christi and United Way of the Coastal Bend awarded \$475,000 to **32 local nonprofit agencies** to help keep them in business during the COVID-19 economic downturn.

The Nonprofit Recovery Fund was established in July 2020 by action of the Corpus Christi City Council. More than 50 Corpus Christi organizations, representing more than \$1.2 million in requests, submitted applications to the fund. Many indicated a loss in revenue due to cancelled fundraisers and decreased donations, leading to cuts in services and employee layoffs.

A review committee comprised of UWCB leadership and a City of Corpus Christi representative carefully reviewed applications and awarded grants ranging from \$3,000 to \$25,000. Applications were reviewed on a first-come, first-served basis and had to meet specific criteria to be considered.

TO INCREASE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES IN THE COASTAL BEND.

Success in life begins with a quality education. However, thousands of Coastal Bend children and youth lack the support they need to strengthen their literacy, stay on track in school, graduate high school and find a career. That's why United Way of the Coastal Bend starts early by helping children ages 0-5 achieve crucial developmental milestones on time and start school ready to succeed.

Working in collaboration with partner agencies, community coalitions, and area school districts, we work to ensure our local youth gain knowledge and skills they need to graduate high school, prepare for future careers, and obtain family-sustaining employment.

TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF FINANCIALLY STABLE FAMILIES IN THE COASTAL BEND.

The key to long-term financial stability is the ability to get and keep a job that pays a living wage. United Way of the Coastal Bend helps those in crisis gain the stability needed to move forward by supporting organizations and programs that provide job training, job placement assistance, adult literacy courses, financial education and emergency support services.

The **Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA)** program helps low- to moderate-income individuals and families file their tax returns and claim available tax credits. Putting money back into the pockets of local taxpayers equates to more money in the Coastal Bend economy.

NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP



Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) is a free community health program that supports first-time moms by having specially-trained nurses regularly visit with and provide support early in the pregnancy through the child's second birthday.

From July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020, the NFP program graduated 26 clients and served 197 women who were:

- First-time mothers
- At or under 28 weeks gestation at time of enrollment
- Resided in Nueces County or within 25 miles of the NFP office (4659 Everhart Road)
- Met certain income requirements

To adapt to the needs of mothers and their families during the pandemic, the NFP program transitioned to telehealth visits and hosted drive-through distribution events to provide basic supplies, diapers, and other items to clients experiencing hardship due to COVID-19.

WORKING TOGETHER TO IMPROVE LIVES

When it comes to improving lives in the Coastal Bend, the level of impact we make in our community is made possible only when we work together.

SUCCESS BY 6 EARLY CHILDHOOD INITIATIVE

The Success By 6 Early Childhood Initiative (Success By 6) is a community coalition focused on improving school readiness in children ages 0-5. Working with local agencies, community partners, schools and childcare centers, the initiative provides resources, workshops and events that are child-focused and family-driven to promote the overall health and development of children in Nueces County.



WOMEN UNITED

Established in late 2019, Women United of the Coastal Bend mobilizes a powerful network of women dedicated to inspiring, educating and encouraging change. The group pools the time, talents and financial resources of its members to demonstrate the positive impact women can have on the local community.

The group began a monthly card-writing campaign called “Uplifting Words” to share hand-written, encouraging notes to groups of people in need of support. The campaign has written hundreds of notes distributed to NICU nurses at Driscoll Children’s Hospital, Nueces County’s MetroCom 911 dispatch team, and countless others.

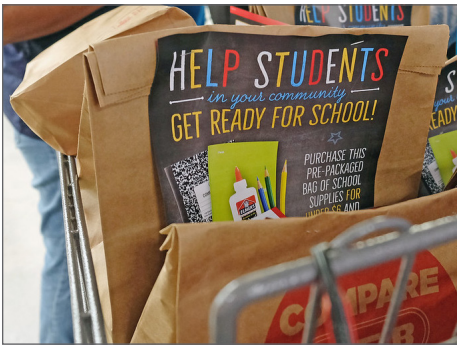

Operation Supply Our Students (SOS) is a community-wide school supply drive and fundraiser benefitting Coastal Bend children grades K-12 with the greatest need. Working in partnership with KRIS Communications and H-E-B, all overhead costs are covered so 100 percent of the proceeds go toward purchasing school supplies. Thanks to the generosity of donors, the 2019 supply drive provided basic school supplies to **more than 10,000 students in 39 Coastal Bend school districts**.

United Way of the Coastal Bend, with presenting sponsor CITGO, hosted its **26th Annual Golf Classic** on October 25, 2019 at the Corpus Christi Country Club.

A total of **214 players** registered to play 18 holes of golf and enjoyed a variety of on-course hors d'oeuvres courtesy of our generous food station sponsors.

The event was a tremendous success and raised **\$91,373** to benefit our **Community Impact Fund**.

CORPUS CHRISTI CALLER-TIMES CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS APPEAL
